- Step 1. Complete your graduation
- Step 2. Prepare for TCF/ TEF Canada & IELTS/CELPIP
- Step 3. Gain 1 year of work experience in India
- Step 4. Create your Express Entry profile
- Step 5. Expect Invitation to Apply - ITA (French Language Proficiency-Category)
- Step 6. Submit Documents and await approval for Canadian Permanent Residency

Tips

- Canada accepts only TCF/ TEF tests, scores valid for 2 years (no other variant of test). However, Pass DELF Test - It is a 'life time' certification of French Language Skills.
- Immigration Consultant - Take services of a RCIC 'Regulated Canadian Immigration Consultant'
- With B1/B2 French, you are 'so close' to NCLC 7 "Just do it' to have 'options'

Express Entry – Canadian Experience Class and Francophone Category

Canadian Experience Class

507, 509, **510-539**, 542,547

- To Compete (cross CRS 510)
- CLB 10, Graduate, Work (3 yrs India, 1 yr Canada), 2 yr Study in Canada gives a CRS score of 508 @ 6 years (after graduation)

CLB: Canadian Language Benchmark for English Language (eg 'IELTS' 6 = CLB 7)

French Language Proficiency

336,365, **375-472**, 478, 486

- To compete (cross CRS 375)
- NCLC 7, CLB 9, Graduate, 1 year work in India gives a CRS score of 385 @ 1 year (after graduation)
- To increase the likelihood (50:50!) (cross CRS of 410)
- NCLC 8, CLB 7, Graduate, 1 year work in India gives a CRS score of 410
- To further increase the likelihood (highest score 478)
- NCLC 9, CLB 9, Graduate, 1 year work in India gives a CRS score of 478

Express Entry – Canadian Experience Class v Francophone Category

Experience Class route: CLB 10, Graduate, Work (3 years in India, 1 year in Canada, 2 year study in Canada = 509 @ 6 years ('maxing out' on work, education, language parameters))

v

Francophone route: NCLC 8, CLB 7, Graduate, Work (1 year in India) = 410 @ 1 year

French Language Proficiency category pathway gives a saving of 5 years and expenses of a two year study program in Canada

If you're studying French (B1, B2, C1, C2), you already hold a key advantage!
B2=NCLC 7-8 | C1 = NCLC 9 | C2 = NCLC 10+
